<p>Site Protocols / Emergency Procedures FH explained the site protocols/emergency procedures with the group attending the meeting at the Roydon Quarry office.</p>
<p>Purpose reiterated The purpose of the CLG must include, but not be limited to, the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) Engagement on an on-going and regular basis on matters associated with the quarrying operations including compliance with CRC resource consents; ii) Promotion of the flow of information relating to all District and Regional consents relating to the quarry including dust monitoring data (including location), metrological data, water abstraction data and groundwater quality data via a publicly available electronic sharing platform, established, operated and maintained by the consent holder to be utilised by the local community and the consent holder so as to, wherever possible, address any issues that may arise; and iii) To discuss the results of monitoring and any matters that may arise as a result of the monitoring
<p>Previous Minutes The previous minutes were approved by the group as a correct record They can now be put onto the website.</p>

Update from Fulton Hogan

- Ashley Shadbolt has taken over from John Perry following his departure from Southern Woods.
- CPSA pit is still being excavated for the stockpile areas.
- Plant has arrived and is currently being established onsite.
- March 2025 is the expected open date.
- Facilities & Maintenance Building construction about to commence, this will house a meeting room and controls for the processing plant – Control Room will soon also start – this is a small room for just the plant start-ups.
- Bund has Porina which has killed the grass, we have recently sprayed the bunds to get rid of the Porina and will reseed these so grass can re-grow. Fulton Hogan proactively engaged with SDC to ensure they were aware of the issue and what remediation was taking place.
- Tractor broom is available onsite at the quarry, should there be a spillage out on the access roads Fulton Hogan can immediately remediate.
- Dust monitors are about to be replaced (have been there for five years and better ones now available). FH will run new ones in parallel for a while.
- All alerts and alarms are active.

Incidents and Complaints

- The roundabout as per consent condition is inspected daily, often Fulton Hogan clean up materials that do not come from their site.
- Sweeping is programmed for the roundabout every Friday to remove any excess dust and debris.
- Fulton Hogan is working with SDC on the final handover of the roundabout, as part of this a final re-mark of the yellow lines along the crossing will be undertaken.
- Some concerns about what happens when at capacity for trucks. Fulton Hogan advised that some days have already operated a maximum capacity for volume as the CPSA is developed.
- SDC were not aware of any complaints in regards to the operation at the Fulton Hogan quarry.
- Kiwirail need to do maintenance works to re-tamp the rail crossing to reduce bouncing trucks traversing the corridor.
- A complaint was received about the viewing platform not being completed yet, Fulton Hogan responded with an update and time-frame (now complete)
- Alerts from monitoring equipment is actively working. Fulton Hogan is working on tuning devices to ensure they are activated prior to consented numbers being reached.
- Fulton Hogan will install cameras along each bund to monitor dust and to monitor trucking movements.

Website

- Baseline trial for Respirable Silica testing is being undertaken in 2024, Fulton Hogan will provide an update in the Templeton Tales to update the community on this.

Public Communications

- Fulton Hogan will provide an update for the November Templeton tails around the baseline trial and the Porina on the bunds.

Community Feedback

- Stephen Bain asked about the protocols for sweeping the roundabout and marking the railway crossing – refer to discussion under Incidents and Complaints above.
