<p>Site Protocols / Emergency Procedures FH explained the site protocols/emergency procedures with the group attending the meeting at the Roydon Quarry office.</p>
<p>Purpose reiterated The purpose of the CLG must include, but not be limited to, the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) Engagement on an on-going and regular basis on matters associated with the quarrying operations including compliance with CRC resource consents; ii) Promotion of the flow of information relating to all District and Regional consents relating to the quarry including dust monitoring data (including location), metrological data, water abstraction data and groundwater quality data via a publicly available electronic sharing platform, established, operated and maintained by the consent holder to be utilised by the local community and the consent holder so as to, wherever possible, address any issues that may arise; and iii) To discuss the results of monitoring and any matters that may arise as a result of the monitoring
<p>Previous Minutes The previous minutes were approved by the group as a correct record They can now be put onto the website.</p>
<p>Update from Fulton Hogan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Meeting started with a tour of the plant. - Going forward Troy Adamson will take over leading the CLG meetings from Richard Smith as the development has come to an end. - Official opening was held on 21st March, Templeton School Kapa Haka attended the opening and performed. - The back left corner of the CPSA has a couple of months left before it is fully dug out. - We will then head to the stage 1 area to begin extraction out from the CPSA. - Once fully operational there will be 2-3 Loader Operators, Quarry Manager and a Plant Operator.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Currently Fulton Hogan and a select few customers loading out from the Quarry until we are fully commissioned and operational. - Reseeding grass following moths/purina infestation has regrown well and no further issues experienced. - Cameras and poles have been installed at the roundabout. These track the trucking routes and allows us to identify anyone that isn't using the approved trucking routes and contact the driver (testing using a truck will occur within the next two months, involving trucks turning the wrong ways – CLG noted this). - Templeton tales going to print later this week. Fulton Hogan provided crash report data for the Jones/Dawsons Rd roundabout which shows no accidents since the roundabout has been commissioned, which is a positive result for the community. - Subject to the weather, we are looking to refresh the road markings around the roundabout later this week. - CPSA ring roads are now totally sealed. This minimises dust and tracking or dirty wheels - Cattle stop (rattler) has been installed at the exit of the CPSA ring road, this kneads the tyres to ensure stones won't get stuck in truck tyres and drop out when leaving site. - Truck and Trailers are taking materials from site, this is a mix of Fulton Hogan trucks and selected customers. - There will be a couple of weeks shutdown of the plant to finalise commissioning of the plant. - -
<p>Incidents and Complaints</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Discussion on complaints register.
<p>Website</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Website is still functional, and air, dust and water monitoring is publicly available. - Dust monitors onsite are nearing end of life, we are currently completing installing new monitors, calibrating and ensuring they are communicating as they should be. The old monitors will remain in place until everything is up and running before switching to new devices.
<p>Public Communications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A community update has been sent to be printed in the Templeton Tales June edition.
<p>Community Feedback</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No truck issues related to the quarry as far as Curraghs, Dawsons are concerned.
